

Well done, lads

TORY chief **Cecil Parkinson** yesterday praised the Task Force's achievements as phenomenal — but warned of more casualties in the days ahead.

He said: "By the end of this chapter in our history, many young men and women will have given their lives in the cause of peace and freedom."

Mr Parkinson, Conservative Party chairman, said our troops had carried out their work with such pro-

fessionalism that people were almost in danger of underestimating what they had achieved.

On the future of the Falklands he said he believed the views of millions of us were reflected by the Colour Sergeant who said: "If they're worth dying for they're worth keeping."

Speaking at the Welsh Conservative Conference at Llandrindod Wells, Powis, Mr Parkinson added: "We are determined to show that aggression will not pay."
